



JADA-JAHM Promotional Video Proposal

As of June 5, 2025

Purpose: Produce a series of short videos that will promote the Joliet Arsenal redevelopment exhibit and the JAHM to the public to generate interest, increase visitors, and tourism to the museum and it's exhibits and entities. This museum properties are framed as points of interest along historic Rt. 66 in the greater Joliet area.

Scope of work: CBH Video will capture a variety of new video footage from the JADA exhibit and newly restored Guard house in Wilmington. Crew will also shoot footage that highlights the JAHM main museum and galleries plus it's entities such as the prison, railroad museum, Planinsek grocery store, Gemini giant, and historic Rt. 66.

CBH will provide pre-production creative development, scripting, production services including a crew of 5 people for 3 days of shooting.

CBH will edit the following:

- 1. 60/30 Arsenal History and redevelopment from the short documentary
- 60/30/15 Second Arsenal Focused Promo: JADA exhibit at JAHM and Guard house, Midewin, ALNC -include Rt 66
- 60/30/15 Second JAHM Overview of museum including the Prison, Railroad Museum, Grocery Store, Gemini Giant include Rt. 66 reference
- 5 minute broll package including footage that can be sent to news media for them to create their own news stories.

These short promotional videos will include mention of historic Rt. 66 and can be used on a variety of digital platforms to market JADA and JAHM entities.

There are several factors that impact the final production costs including the running time for each video as well as the use of voice over. The following estimate has a breakdown of costs and a few optional figures for your consideration. One variable is the cost of voice over talent because if we are going to hire an experienced voice over professional, we ideally know the distribution platforms before recording the final VO. To effectively market video ads or spots you will probably consider a mix of traditional and digital outlets. There are many options to target specific platforms based on your audience and campaign goals. Before recording the VO try to determine how the museum or JADA would leverage social media and if you will specifically do paid placement on FB, Insta, You Tube, Google ads, or Linked In. Also, are you considering local TV media or cable outlets? TV is more expensive and adds to the cost outlined. We will further investigate once it's decided to give an updated number.

VIDEO PRODUCTION CONTRACT

This Agreement is entered into by and between JADA Joliet Arsenal Development Authority, located at 2364 Essington Rd., suite 301 Joliet, Illinois 60435, hereinafter referred to as "JADA" and CBH Video Production & Creative Services, Inc., 120 E. Ogden Ave, Hinsdale, Illinois, 60521, hereinafter referred to as "CBH." In consideration of mutual agreements contained herein, CBH agrees to produce 8 short promotional video segments and a broll package featuring footage from the JADA documentary and exhibits at the Joliet Area Historical Museum.

Scope of Work

CBH Video will capture a variety of new video footage from the JADA exhibit and newly restored Guard house in Wilmington. Crew will also shoot footage that highlights the JAHM main museum and galleries plus its entities such as the prison, railroad museum, Planinsek grocery store, Gemini giant, and historic Rt. 66.

CBH will edit the following:

- 1. 60/30 Arsenal History and redevelopment from the short documentary
- 2. 60/30/15 Second Arsenal Focused Promo: JADA exhibit at JAHM and Guard house, Midewin, ALNC -include Rt 66
- 3. 60/30/15 Second JAHM Overview of museum including the Prison, Railroad Museum, Grocery Store, Gemini Giant include Rt. 66 reference
- 4. 5 minute broll package including footage that can be sent to news media for them to create their own news stories.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS & EQUIPMENT

Approval: JADA has approval rights at all stages of production. All approval copies and delivery charges are included as well as online approvals.

Visual Treatment: Determined by producer with approval and input from JADA

Script: Written by producer with approval by JADA

Video: Requires using existing footage shot in 2022 for the JADA documentary and supplemental

footage or photos as provided by JAHM and the various entities.

Audio: Audio needs to be on separate tracks throughout the acquisition and editing process as well as in the final archived project. A combination of interviews on screen typography and music may be used to tell the story. A professional voice over narrator will be used. CBH is responsible for securing music rights. All music must be documented to submit to third-party vendor for replication. Music licensing and rights are required for videos.

Graphics/Effects: 2D graphic maps and animation if used in the documentary may be used in these

segments. An animated title for each will be created.

Masters: Video files are to be formatted for broadcast, internet, and social media platforms. Final programs are to be provided to JADA along with a copy of the original uncompressed files. Production team shall archive video footage and final edited programs.

Deliverable specs

The following formats are required for the program specified above:

- MP4 (1080p)
- **ProRes Master Files**
- **Final Scripts**
- Source Materials

The video must be 100% quality checked to make sure the video meets broadcast and web standards. All digital files are to be provided on a hard drive and uploaded to Dropbox for JADA to share online and with stakeholders.

PURCHASE PRICE AND PAYMENT TERMS

JADA agrees to pay CBH for services performed hereunder, a total sum not to exceed \$49,235 split into two payments. First payment is within one week of signing of the contract in the amount of \$24,617.50. Second payment of \$24,617.50 is due upon completion of all filming and editing. Payment terms are net 10 days from date of invoice. Any changes in the price or scope of work for these videos must be mutually agreed upon by both parties and documented in writing. This sum is payable within 10 days of receipt of the invoice. In the event JADA does not approve the completed video for any reason other than a force majeure event, JADA and CBH shall cooperate in good faith so that the video may be completed to JADA's satisfaction.

OWNERSHIP RIGHTS

CBH agrees that it will secure the necessary copyright releases on any recorded music that CBH secures. CBH assumes neither responsibility for securing releases nor determining if releases are necessary on any materials, music or photographs supplied to CBH by JADA or one of its suppliers or agencies. CBH shall secure the necessary copyright releases and ownership rights on all photos or video that CBH independently acquires for the video. JADA has approval rights at every stage of production. CBH grants permission to JADA to present on a per use basis certain proprietary stock art and photography owned by CBH. All video recordings used for the production of the video shall be the sole and exclusive property of JADA. CBH further agrees that all raw media, and source materials, animation files and art files utilized under this contract will be provided to JADA upon request, or if not explicitly requested, upon submission of the final deliverable(s). JADA allows CBH to use the video as an example of their work on CBH's website and social media channels.

INSURANCE

CBH will maintain insurance from a qualified and licensed insurer in good financial standing throughout the term of this Agreement. Such insurance will include (a) a policy of workers' compensation insurance with coverage limits as may be required by the law of the state in which the services are to be performed; (b) adequate general liability insurance providing coverage against liability for bodily injury, death and property damage which may arise out of or be based upon any act or omission of CBH or any of its employees, agents, contractors or subcontractors under this Agreement; and (c) such other insurance which is reasonably required by JADA in connection with the performance of the service hereunder. At JADA's option and upon its request, CBH will name JADA as an additional insured. The insurance shall be primary over any other insurance covering JADA and shall remain in effect continuously for the term of this Agreement. Also upon written request, CBH shall promptly provide certificate(s) from its insurers indicating the amount of insurance coverage, the nature of such coverage and the expiration date of written notice of any cancellation, non-renewal or significant modification of the scope or limits of any coverage. The certificate will be in a form, which JADA can verify provides continuing insurance coverage through the term of this Agreement. The terms of this section will survive the termination of this Agreement.

INDEMNIFICATION

CBH agrees to indemnify and hold harmless JADA, its directors, officers, employees and agents, from any losses, damages or costs, including reasonable attorney fees, incurred in connection with any court judgment or jury verdict against them or any one or more of them as a result of any suits for copyright infringement based on materials, music or photographs supplied by CBH. JADA and CBH agree to give each other immediate notice of any such claim or suit and to cooperate fully with each other in the defense of any such claim or suit. JADA shall have full charge of the defense provided, however, CBH shall have the right to engage counsel of its choice at its expense to participate in the defense of any such claim or suit. JADA agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CBH, its directors, officers, employees and agents from any losses, damages or costs, including reasonable attorney fees, incurred in connection with any judgment or jury verdict against them as a result of any suits for copyright infringement based on materials, music or photographs supplied by JADA.

CBH will indemnify and hold harmless JADA and its respective employees, agents and representatives, against any and all liabilities, judgments, damages, claims, demands, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) or losses, arising in connection with the services to be provided hereunder, due to CBH's negligence, breach of warranty or failure to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The terms of this section will survive the termination of this Agreement.

STATUS OF PARTIES

CBH and its agents and employees in the performance of this Agreement shall and do act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of LCI. CBH shall be and does assume all responsibilities as an employer in connection herewith and shall discharge all federal and state reports of an employer in force during the terms hereof, including but not by way of limitation, those relating to taxes, unemployment taxes, disability benefits, tax withholding employment of minors, the filing of returns or reports required of employers, and the payment of all tax assessments, contributions and other sums required of employers.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement represents the entire Agreement between JADA and CBH with respect to the preparation and purchase of the video and supersedes any prior agreement and negotiations between parties. No alterations or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by JADA and CBH. This Agreement shall be governed by and constituted in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. JADA and CBH each represent that they have the power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that this Agreement constitutes a valid and binding obligation of each party.

ASSIGNABILITY

This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of each of the parties hereto and the respective successor and permitted assigns of each. Neither party may assign this Agreement in whole or in part without the prior written approval of the other party.

TIME FOR PERFORMANCE

Time is of the essence of this Agreement. All approval responses must be immediate to the extent that production is not impeded.

FORCE MAJEURE

If either party is unable to perform the services required under the terms of this Agreement due to strikes, Acts of God, acts of war and terrorism, or restrictions imposed by any government or government agency or delays beyond CBH reasonable control, the parties agree JADA shall have absolute right in its sole discretion, to act as follows:

Declare this Agreement null and void and without effect and obtain the services to be performed by CBH from other sources or require CBH to provide that service which it can reasonably perform and obtain additional service necessary to fulfill the requirements of this Agreement from other sources. In either case, JADA agrees to pay within thirty (30) days of receipt of an itemized billing the services that CBH has actually performed in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

CANCELLATION

Either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days notice to the other party. In the event of cancellation by JADA, JADA will be responsible for payment to CBH for services actually performed. CBH shall refund that portion of the JADA's payment not representative of its services performed and shall immediately return all video recordings to JADA.

INTERESTS

To the extent that JADA does not pay any undisputed amount owed to CBH within 15 days of the due date under this Agreement, interest shall accrue on such outstanding amount from the date due until paid in full at a per monthly interest rate of 5%.

The purpose of this Act is to facilitate 7 8 and promote the utilization of property that is located along the Illinois Waterway throughout Will County and property 9 10 formerly occupied and used by the United States government as an ammunition plant and arsenal and to replace and enhance the 11 12 economic benefits generated by those former uses with diversified projects and land uses that will create new job 13 14 opportunities and foster new economic development within the 15 area.

- 3 (a) The Joliet Arsenal Development Authority is created as

The mayors of the 4 municipalities of Channahon, Crest Hill, Elwood, Joliet, 5 Lockport, Manhattan, Rockdale, Romeoville, Symerton, and 6 Wilmington shall each appoint one member of the Board of 7 Directors. All members appointed to the Board shall be 8 9 residents of Will County. , but of the 6 members who are appointed by the Will County Executive, with the advice and 10 11 consent of the Will County Board, one shall be a resident of the City of Joliet, one a resident of the City of Wilmington, 12 13 one a resident of the Village of Elwood, one a resident of the Village of Manhattan, one a resident of the Village of 14 15 Symerton, and one an at-large resident of Will County. Each 16 city council or village board shall recommend 3 individuals who are residents of the city or village to the Will County 17 18 Executive to be members of the Board of Directors. The Will 19 County Executive shall choose one of the recommended 20 individuals from each city and village and shall submit those 21 names to the Will County Board for approval. All persons 22 appointed as members of the Board shall have recognized ability and experience in one or more of the following areas: 23 24 development, finance, banking, economic industrial 25 development, small business management, real estate 26 development, community development, venture finance, organized 1

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labor, units of local government, or civic, community, or neighborhood organization.

(d) (Blank). Within 30 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly, the Will County Executive, with the advice and consent of the Will County Board, shall appoint the additional member of the Board for an initial term expiring on the third Monday in January, 2013. The member must be an at large resident of Will County. The Board members holding office on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly shall continue to hold office for the remainder of their respective terms. All successors shall be appointed by the original appointing authority and hold office for a term of 4 years commencing the third Monday in January of the year in which their term commences, except in case of an appointment to fill a vacancy. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the term. In case of vacancy in a Governor appointed membership when the Senate is not in session, the Governor may make a temporary appointment until the next meeting of the Senate when a person shall be nominated to fill that office, and any person so nominated who is confirmed by the Senate shall hold office during the remainder of the term. Each member appointed to the Board shall serve until his or her successor is appointed and qualified.

(d-10) Within 30 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 104th General Assembly, the mayors

1 Romeoville, Lockport, Crest Hill, Rockdale, and Channahon shall each appoint one additional member of the Board for an 2 initial term expiring on the third Monday in January of the 3 year in which their term commences. Sec. 55. Abolition of Authority. The Authority shall be 2 abolished upon the last to occur of the following: (1) 3 expiration of the 35-year period that begins on the 4 effective date of this Act; or (2) one year after all revenue 5 bonds, notes, and other evidences of indebtedness of the 6 Authority have been fully paid and discharged or otherwise 7 provided for. Upon the abolition of the Authority, all of its 8 rights and property shall pass to and be vested in Will County 9 10 the State.
